 How do you think ancient Roman citizens would view our modern idea of peace compared to theirs?

Read Together:

Luke 1:5 & 2:1

In the time of <u>Herod, king of Judea</u>.....In those days <u>Caesar Augustus</u> issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire **Roman world**.

2 Kings 17:7 & 19-20

All this took place because the Israelites had sinned against the Lord their God, who had brought them up out of Egypt from under the power of Pharaoh king of Egypt. They worshiped other gods.....and even Judah did not keep the commands of the Lord their God. They followed the practices Israel had introduced. Therefore the Lord rejected all the people of Israel; he afflicted them and gave them into the hands of plunderers, until he thrust them from his presence.

Ezekiel 36:24-26

"For I will take you out of the nations; I will gather you from all the countries and bring you back into your own land. I will sprinkle clean water on you, and you will be clean; I will cleanse you from all your impurities and from all your idols. I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you; I will remove from you your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh.

But the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary; you have found favor with God. You will conceive and give birth to a son, and **you are to call him Jesus**. He will be great and will be called the **Son of the Most High**.
