Open Up:

• Have you ever received a message that totally changed the way you saw something?"

Read Together:

Hebrews 4:12

For the word of God is living and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart

Jeremiah 29:11

For I know the plans I have for you, "declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.

Jeremiah 29:12-14

Then you will call on me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart. I will be found by you," declares the LORD, "and will bring you back from captivity. I will gather you from all the nations and places where I have banished you," declares the LORD, "and will bring you back to the place from which I carried you into exile."

- Why is it important to read the Bible **in community** rather than just alone? How can others help us see things we might miss?
- Augustine said that all understanding of scripture should lead to **loving God and loving others**. How can we make sure our Bible reading is leading us to live that out?
- If the Bible is meant to transform us, what is one passage that has significantly **shaped your life**?

Pray:

Pray that God would open your hearts to hear His voice clearly and give the courage

to respond in faith. Pray for Him to help you recognize how He speaks through Scripture, circumstances, and the people around you.
