Open Up:

Read Together:

Matthew 5:17-18

"Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; <u>I have not come to</u> abolish them but to fulfill them. For truly I tell you, until heaven and earth disappear, not the smallest letter, not the least stroke of a pen, will by any means disappear from the Law <u>until everything is accomplished</u>.

And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he explained to them <mark>what was said</mark> in all the Scriptures concerning himself.

The disciples were called Christians first at Antioch.

Also, reflect on the five points of application the message shared:

- 2. It's dangerous to base theology on one passage of scripture.
- 3. Take scripture seriously, but not always literally.
- 4. Scripture will not contradict itself, but it may cause tension for us.
- 5. The Bible cannot mean what it never meant.

-What are the risks of basing our theology on one isolated passage? How might this lead to a distorted view of God's overall message?

-The sermon suggests we should "take scripture seriously, but not always literally." How do you determine when to read a passage figuratively versus literally?

-How can we guard against using scripture to justify our pre-existing beliefs rather than letting it transform us? What steps have you found helpful to overcome confirmation bias?

-How does discerning the original intent of the biblical authors impact the way we apply scripture in our lives today? Can you provide an example where this made a significant difference?

-What do you think it means to apply the Bible in a way that "looks like Jesus"? How can this concept guide your understanding of what it means to live out your faith?
