Origins #6 A Land I Will Show You February 18, 2024

What is the farthest you have moved from where you grew up?

We hear the Bible differently and beautifully when it is read in a community of people. As a group, read Genesis 12:1-8.

Today we finish up our journey through the beginning of Genesis.

What is something from this series that has stood out to you?

Genesis12:1-3

"The Lord had said to Abram, "Go from your country, your people and your father's household to **the land I will show you**. "I will make you into **a great nation**, and **I will bless you**; I will make your name great, and you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and whoever curses you I will curse, and **all peoples on earth will be blessed through you**."

- Why do you think God didn't tell Abram up front where he would be going?
- Why do you think God didn't extend the invitation to the entire family, Abram's father and brothers included?
- In what ways can you relate to Abram's calling?

God is creating a people at the center of the world to bless all nations. He does not choose an already existing people, but He creates a new one. He picks an unlikely choice in an idol-worshipping, immigrant barren couple. The Biblical story is going to follow Abram's family and their purpose. The Old Testament will focus on Israel as a nation, and her rise and eventual fall. The New Testament tells us how, out of the remnant of Israel, God will reform his people as the church. The church centers on Jesus and His death, resurrection, and ascension. As the Messiah and fulfillment of Israel, Jesus is making everything new. He ascends as Lord having reclaimed all authority on earth and heaven. This is the good news. The Gospel. Jesus is Lord over everything. The church is those who embody where all of creation is headed.
